Raisin' Blazen! - A Resurrection on Christmas Eve

This account is based on one of many witnesses to the glory of resurrection at our Family Service a few weeks ago. The Family Christmas Eve Service was advertised to the hilt on Facebook as a hands-on, live animal event for children and their families. I had booked our favorite donkey, Blazen, under care of owner, Janet Vance, to return Christmas Eve after a glorious Christmas on the Hill showing. Blazen along with Baby Princess Di, a baby mule, were to participate inside the church during our play. Grace Kim, our then Assistant of Children and Youth Ministries, and I had taken our families to see Janet's ranch north of Weatherford, a week before. Our trip was intended to groom Grace's boys and my grandkids into holding the donkey or a chicken during the Christmas Eve interactive play. Everything went well until we went into her chicken house, where all the chickens literally flew the coop; our kids had failed to keep the chickens safely wrapped in their arms. She insisted they couldn't participate this year holding a chicken; Janet needed her animals safe at St. Stephen.



When Christmas Eve arrived, Grace and I had set up the scenery, arranged costumes for angels, camels, wise persons, shepherds, donkeys, cows, sheep so that any child who came could participate in our re-telling of Jesus birth. As the clock neared 5 p.m., Shari Lincoln, church member and donkey owner herself, was waiting on Janet and the donkey trailer to arrive so the service could begin. I kept greeting and meeting people promising costumes to each child and waiting on the thumbs up for the service to start. Chaos unfolded. Children were trying on costumes and running in and out of pews and into the Crossing posing for mom and dad. (I love chaos and made NO attempt to quell the riot.) It was similar to "We're Full. No Vacancy", busy streets of Bethlehem. Soon I was alerted that Blazen and company had arrived but was in trouble. His back right hoof had gotten caught in the spare tire hub found in the trailer! I made a plea asking, "We ask for your patience as we stall the start of the service. Blazen, our donkey, is trapped in a wheel. We hope to get him out soon. Anyone a veterinarian?" No vets came a running to the West Transept doors, but a few dads and granddads flew out to help, along with my daughter. Thank you, Dan Miles, Scott Gaffney, Shari Lincoln, Robby and Felicia Fultz for responding and any other unnamed assistants.



As they battled a tough tire hub, we soon learned this news: "Blazen is upset and still trapped. We called the Fire Department! No animals will appear tonight." I quickly apologized to all who came with the thought of clutching a live animal during our Nativity Play. "There will be no animals tonight. We apologize." And our service began.

We had soloists, Children's and Choristers' Choir sang, a few hymns were lifted to the ceiling before the Interactive Play began with Pastor Angie, Burkley Massey, and Charlie Miles (angel) acting as our narrators. Mary and Joseph had started their journey to Bethlehem, when out in the Crossing a Donkey appeared! No, not Blazen but little Princess Di. She calmly walked into the Crossing with a handler and two chickens were also in tow. The chaos never stopped! We had sweet angels show the peevish shepherds how to get to the stable; cows and sheep were running wild near the manger; and sweet Princess Di brought the Holy Family! What a delight it was. After the play, we offered a prayer for the animals placing our hands upon the unfazed animals.



As we invited friends to come into the crossing for singing "Silent Night" to end our service, the doors to the West Transept open and in walked the wounded but placid Blazen - without a tire, waiting patiently to be a part of our Nativity. Those around me leaped with joy as we realized that Blazen had been saved by the FW Fire Department's welding equipment and our brave volunteers. Singing by candlelight, in the dark with two donkeys - both perfectly behaved — was beautiful. A grand re-telling of Jesus' Birth was enhanced with our side story of a broken animal rescued and resurrected at the end of our "Silent Night". It was the miracle of a donkey made whole again. A Christmas Resurrection happened and I was there with my church family, my family, and a lot of friends to behold and revel in God's and the Fire Department's mercy!


Following compline, you are invited to walk the candlelit labyrinth. A guide and booklet with prayers and information on our labyrinth will be provided.

PARISH HEALTH NEWS

The FDA recently approved an Alzheimer's drug shown in clinical trials to slow cognitive decline in patients in the early stages of the illness. The approval offers patients renewed hope after repeated failures to find effective treatments, even though there have been reports of side effects such as swelling of the brain or brain bleeding.

The drug, lecanemab, which will be sold under the name Lequembi, is a monoclonal antibody infusion given every two weeks. The drug was approved in an *accelerated pathway*, which allows early approval for promising new medications that "fill an unmet medical need." Lequembi is NOT a cure; it aims to slow the progression of the disease by removing clumps of beta-amyloid thought by scientist to be one of the main causes of Alzheimer's disease.

- We have resumed inviting people to come forward for communion. We also continue to provide communion packets in the pews for those who prefer to remain seated.


